Founded by the British in 1946 as a teacher training institution, it was granted the title of "Universität" in 2000 and became "Europa-Universität" in 2014. With ca. 6000 students it is a relatively small university. Its study programs focus on teacher training, international management, environmental sciences / sustainable development and interdisciplinary European studies.

From its unique border location, Europa-Universität Flensburg is ideally situated to fulfill its commitment to living out the European vision of intercultural encounters and exploring its reality. For over twenty years, Europa-Universität Flensburg and the Danish Syddansk Universitet have been partnering to offer joint degree programs in management, giving students the opportunity to earn degrees from both universities simultaneously.

The region is characterized by beaches, wind and the sea. Situated directly on the Fjord, Flensburg's impressive historic buildings, low rents, lively cultural scene and close proximity to Scandinavia make it an excellent place to live and study.



Career Opportunities

This bachelor's degree offers students the professional and methodical knowledge to either immediately pursue a career in a growing labor market with a strong demand for well qualified professionals with specialized knowledge of European issues, or to enroll in a master's program.



Program Structure



Introduction (1st and 2nd semester):

- The area "Topics and Disciplines" covers an introduction to how Europe is portrayed and discussed in cultural studies and social sciences.
- The area "Doing Europe" focuses on academic skills and research methods. It provides an introduction to the project fields of research, journalism, entrepreneurship, and art and scenography, in which students might later apply for practical training and job opportunities.

Development and Focus (3rd semester onward):

During the **3rd semester** students choose one of two points of focus: either European Cultures or European Society. Within the chosen point of focus, students deepen their academic knowledge in the area "Topics and Disciplines," as well as their practical abilities in

the area "Doing Europe" by expanding their research methodology skills and implementing their knowledge in one project field. Students also have elective topics from other areas at this time

Students deepen their knowledge through the interdisciplinary study of current problems and debates related to European cultures or society.

During the 4th or 5th semester, students complete their **semester abroad**. To help them prepare, language courses are offered, free of charge.

The **6th semester** is mainly dedicated to writing the bachelor's thesis, with the support of a colloquium and other academic courses.

Course of Studies and Content



European focus:

This program exposes students to a wide range of topics and disciplines, presented from various perspectives, to enable them to understand European issues and improve their problem-solving skills.

Project-based learning:

- Journalism takes students through the steps needed to complete journalistic tasks.
- Research prepares students to a scientific career by advancing their scientific research skills.
- Entrepreneurship empowers students to become capable and independent business managers.
- Art & Scenography transforms students' creativity into a scenic output.

Semester Abroad:

To enrich their perspective on Europe, all students complete a semester abroad during their studies. The goal is to experience first-hand different cultures, societies, languages, educational systems, etc.
