Description/content	The Master's in International Management (MAIM) is a two-year postgraduate programme that is accredited by FIBBA and internationally recognised.

The programme is taught entirely in English and is designed for talented and ambitious students

with a first degree in business studies who are seeking managerial positions for their future professional careers.

The curriculum includes key managerial areas such as international strategic management, international accounting, sustainable leading and reporting, financial management, international marketing, and human resource management as well as international law and taxation. The modules in Advanced International Economics and Quantitative Methods complete the compulsory catalogue. Furthermore, compulsory optional modules such as Operations Management, Academic English, and Communication are also offered.

The course includes an obligatory twelve-week internship abroad and a thesis.

Semester contribution	Students must pay 364 EUR for the 2024/2025 winter semester. Upon paying the semester fee, you will receive your student ID, with which you will get discounts on meals in the campus cafeteria ("Mensa") and gain access to on-campus cultural activities such as university sports, choir, a theatre group and many more. The so-called semester ticket is also included in the semester fee. This ticket entitles you to free public transport within the entire federal state of Saarland.

With approximately 180,000 inhabitants, Saarbrücken is the perfect size for an active student life. It is safe to walk and ride your bike everywhere, and the next pub, cinema, restaurant, gym or supermarket is never far away. When it is time for a break from the books, there is always plenty going on, both on and off campus. Saarbrücken is a modern, dynamic city with a French flair that offers a variety of pubs and clubs as well as a diverse cultural scene.
