The three-year Bachelor's programme is offered at the campus of the Europa-Universität Flensburg (EUF).

This Bachelor's programme is an interdisciplinary study programme focusing on the cultural and social sciences of Europe. Empirical research methods as well as hermeneutic methods and critical thinking enable students to work in interdisciplinary settings.

One of the particular features throughout this programme is its project-based application of academic knowledge in the fields of research, journalism, art and scenography or entrepreneurship. This prepares students for dealing with the practical challenges of their future careers.

As an international BA, with all classes taught in English, the programme requires the completion of one semester abroad.

Course Details

Course organisation

EUCS follows a modular structure, which makes it more adaptable to students' needs and preferences than other Bachelor's programmes. Therefore, the structure presented below is flexible.

Introduction (first and second semester):

- The area "Topics and Disciplines" covers an introduction to how Europe is portrayed and discussed in cultural studies and social sciences.
- The area "Doing Europe" focuses on academic skills and research methods. It provides an introduction to the project fields of research, journalism, entrepreneurship, and art and scenography, in which students might later apply for practical training and job opportunities.

Development and Focus (third semester onward):

During the **third semester** students choose one of two points of focus: either "European Cultures" or "European Society". Within the chosen point of focus, students deepen their academic knowledge in the area "Topics and Disciplines" as well as their practical abilities in the area "Doing Europe" by expanding their research methodology skills and implementing their knowledge in one project field. Students also have elective topics from other areas at this time.

Students deepen their knowledge through the interdisciplinary study of current problems and debates related to European cultures or society.

During the **fourth or fifth semester**, students complete their **semester abroad**. To help them prepare, language courses are offered that are free of charge.

The **sixth semester** is mainly dedicated to writing the Bachelor's thesis with the support of a colloquium and other academic courses.

European focus:

This programme exposes students to a wide range of topics and disciplines presented from various perspectives, which enables them to understand European issues and improve their problem-solving skills.

Project-based learning:

- Journalism takes students through the steps needed to complete journalistic tasks.

- Research prepares students for scientific careers by advancing their scientific research skills.
- Entrepreneurship empowers students to become capable and independent business managers.
- Art & Scenography transforms students' creativity into a scenic output.

Semester Abroad:

To enrich their perspective on Europe, all students complete a semester abroad during their studies. The goal is to experience first-hand different cultures, societies, languages, educational systems, etc.

After completing this Bachelor's programme, you will be prepared to start your career, develop your own projects or continue to pursue a Master's programme anywhere in the world.

Types of assessment	<p>Students are assessed in a variety of ways, so as to allow for a better understanding of several professional skills. Among the assessment types are the following: essays, papers, presentations, written and oral exams, projects, reports and other assignments.</p> <p>Students earn ECTS (European Credit Transfer and Accumulation System) points for each study module that they successfully complete. Credit points are awarded when the respective module has been passed and the required coursework submitted. Credits are automatically granted every time a student receives a grade. Assessments and coursework are usually graded.</p> <p>Students need to complete a total of 180 ECTS points.</p>

Integrated study abroad unit(s)	<p>The programme requires the completion of one semester abroad. The fourth and fifth semesters are organised in a way that makes it easier for students to choose to complete their semester abroad during this period of time. To make the integration abroad smoother, students are encouraged to take part in the many language courses offered by the Language Centre of the Europa-Universität Flensburg. These courses are free of charge.</p> <p>The semester abroad can be financed by ERASMUS+ funds from the European Union. Other funding possibilities might also be available.</p>

Tuition fees per semester in EUR	None
Semester contribution	Students must pay a semester contribution of approx. 25 EUR for matriculation fees. They must also pay about 240 EUR per semester (semi-annually) to the Studentenwerk. This contribution covers the fees for the administration and the Studentenwerk as well as public transport within the state of Schleswig-Holstein and the city of Hamburg.
Costs of living	The cost of living is generally slightly lower than in major German cities. A budget of 700 to 850 EUR per month should cover the basic cost of living, including rent. More details are available here .

Requirements / Registration

Academic admission requirements	A high school background considered equivalent to the German "Abitur" is required. More information can be found here or here .
Language requirements	<p>International applicants: can prove they possess sufficient knowledge of English by a school-leaving qualification from an English-speaking school qualifying for university entrance or by obtaining one of the following certificates:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">• FCE (First Certificate in English): grade A, B• CAE (Certificate in Advanced English): grade A, B, C• CPE (Certificate of Proficiency in English): grade A, B, C• IELTS Academic (International English Language Testing System): band score 6.5 or superior• TOEFL (Test of English as a Foreign Language): Internet-based testing: min. 90 points (from max. 120) <p>National applicants may also prove their knowledge of the English language by showing an average grade of at least 10 points in the subject English during the German "gymnasiale Oberstufe", with English being continued up until the point that the high school diploma has been awarded (average value of the last four semesters).</p> <p>For all applicants: The certificate proving knowledge of English must not have been obtained longer than two years prior to the start of the study programme.</p>

Situated in the German-Danish border region, Germany's northernmost university is a young university. Founded in 1946 by the British, it was awarded university status in 2000. Since 2014, it has been known as "Europa-Universität". In 2017, the Europa-Universität Flensburg (EUF) adapted its semester times to correspond with international semester times: In the spring semester, the lecture period runs from March to June; in the fall semester, it runs from September to December. With around 6,300 students, it is a comparatively small university. Young people from around 90 nations study on the Flensburg campus.

The main study programmes focus on educational science and interdisciplinary European studies as well as on environmental sciences / sustainable development.

The location in the border region is ideal for a university with a mission to live the European dream of intercultural encounters and explore its reality. For almost 30 years, Europa-Universität Flensburg and Danish Syddansk Universitet have been working closely together. Their double degree courses in economics offer students the opportunity to obtain degrees from both universities simultaneously.

The region is characterised by beaches, wind, and the sea. Situated directly on the fjord, with its impressive old buildings, low rent, a lively cultural scene, and close proximity to Scandinavia, Flensburg offers excellent living and studying conditions.



University location

The city of Flensburg is characterised by its waterside location and by the immediate proximity of its neighbouring country, Denmark. Located at the northernmost point in Germany, the city of Flensburg is the gateway to Scandinavia. It is only a few miles drive to the Danish border; the Kingdom of Denmark is located even closer to Flensburg than Husum or Kiel, and it can actually be seen from the beach at Wassersleben.

The campus is located about two kilometres from the city centre. Approximately one in ten residents of Flensburg is enrolled at Europa-Universität Flensburg or at the University of Applied Sciences. This is particularly noticeable during the summer months, when there is a lively atmosphere in this university town. As soon as the cold days are over and the last lectures have ended, students meet at the beach or at "the place to be" in the harbour, the "Hafenspitze".

Whether it's the reflecting water, the sail boats rocking gently in the waves, the sunset, or the fact that there is always someone you know – everyone likes the heart of Flensburg.

Away from the water, Flensburg's historical city centre and its identity, developed over many centuries, is one of the landmarks of the city. Spared attacks in times of war, Art Nouveau style houses and old villas can be found everywhere in the city. Its small streets are home to cafés, numerous courtyards, rum producers, a wide pedestrian zone, harbour pubs, and several beaches.
