Description/content	<p>The MSc European Economics is a unique double degree programme offering a comprehensive and flexible graduate level economics education combined with an integrated year of study in either Pavia (Italy), Nottingham (England) or Marseille (France).</p> <p>Students spend one year at the University of Tübingen and one year at the partner university of their choice, either the Università degli studi di Pavia, the University of Nottingham or Aix-Marseille Université. Living and studying in Italy, England or France, students gain valuable skills and capacities necessary to compete in the European economic world. Due to the international focus of the programme, graduates are able to get into different working procedures in different countries efficiently and adopt beneficial practices employed in other cultures.</p> <p>In addition to the MSc in European Economics, students are granted a Master's degree from their chosen partner university. Thus, graduates have a wide range of career options in international companies or institutions in the public sector.</p>

Course Details

Course organisation	<p>The Master of Science programme in European Economics is completed at the University of Tübingen and either at the Università degli Studi di Pavia, the University of Nottingham or Aix-Marseille Université.</p> <p>The part of the programme that is completed at the University of Tübingen is divided into three main areas of study: core studies, specialisation studies, and elective studies. Students focus on up to two specialisations from the areas of economics, international economics, finance, and econometrics. To complete the programme, students have to obtain a total of 120 ECTS credits, 60 ECTS credits at each of the two universities.</p> <p>For the Pavia option, there are two modes of study, depending on whether or not the Master's thesis is completed at the University of Tübingen. Students who choose to spend their first year at the University of Tübingen will write the Master's thesis while studying at the University of Pavia in their second year. Students studying at the University of Pavia in their first year will write the Master's thesis at the University of Tübingen. As a consequence, the course load for each institution depends on whether the student is in the first or second year of the programme.</p> <p>With the Nottingham option, students spend their first year in Nottingham studying "Environmental Leadership and Management" before they continue their studies in Tübingen during their second year, which includes writing a Master's thesis co-supervised by one professor from each university.</p> <p>When choosing the Marseille option, students begin their studies in Tübingen and take modules based on the track they want to follow in the second year in Marseille: Economics or Finance. They will also write their Master's thesis at Aix-Marseille Université.</p> <p>For further information, please take a look at our website.</p>

Integrated study abroad unit(s)	Students are obliged to study at the Università degli Studi di Pavia, the University of Nottingham or the Aix-Marseille Université for two semesters. Students will obtain 60 of the 120 ECTS credits at the partner institution. At the end of their studies, students are conferred two Master's degrees.

Semester contribution	Enrolment fees at the University of Tübingen are currently about 160 EUR per semester. This includes use of local public transport free of charge from Monday to Friday (in the evenings), at weekends and on public holidays. In addition, students may purchase a semester ticket for unlimited use of public transport in the city of Tübingen and the surrounding area (currently about 110 EUR).
Costs of living	According to the Tübingen Student Services Organisation (“Studierendenwerk”), estimated basic student expenses are about 950 EUR per month, including rent for student accommodation. Rent for private accommodation will typically be more expensive.

Requirements / Registration

Academic admission requirements	<p>Admission to the Master of Science in European Economics requires a Bachelor’s degree in Business Administration or Economics with a grade better than 2.5, preferably a degree that amounts to 180 ECTS credits. Applicants are expected to be familiar with the basic principles, theories and concepts in the field of economics. In addition, sound intermediate level knowledge in three of the following areas is expected:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Microeconomics • Trade Theory and Policy • Finance

Language requirements

English (one of the following is required):

- TOEFL iBT: 80
- TOEFL PBT: 550
- IELTS: 6.5 (Overall band)
- Cambridge: CAE, CPE or BEC Higher
- TOEIC: 700
- UNlcert III Certificate
- German "Abitur" including at least six (G8) or seven (G9) years of English
- Officially recognised higher education degree (e.g. Bachelor's degree) with English as the language of instruction (You must provide a medium of instruction certificate stating that the programme was conducted in English, unless the language of instruction is definitively stated on your transcript!)

Please note: The University of Nottingham requires an IELTS of 6.5 (no less than 6.0 in any element) or an [equivalent qualification](#).

Please also note that language requirements might be subject to change in the future.

German is not required. However, German classes are available.

Italian is not a formal requirement, as classes in Pavia are taught in English. But it is strongly advised to take at least one language course in preparation for the stay abroad if the student is not yet fluent in Italian.

French is also not a formal requirement, as classes in Marseille are taught in English. But it is strongly advised to take at least one language course in preparation for the stay abroad if the student is not yet fluent in French.

Please note that even though classes in English are available at all partner universities, it is essential for the double degree experience to have some command over the national language spoken at the partner university.

Students have the possibility to take various language courses at our Language Learning Centre.

Services

Accommodation

Accommodation is available through the student services organisation ("Studierendenwerk") or on the private market. Rooms in student accommodation cost approx. 200–400 EUR per month. As Tübingen is a very attractive place to live, private accommodation is more expensive and can take some effort to find. To make sure you find a suitable place to live, you should start looking as early as possible.

We recommend you apply for student accommodation through the "Studierendenwerk" at the same time that you apply for admission to the Master's programme (<https://www.my->

[stuwe.de/en/housing/halls-of-residence-tuebingen/](https://www.my-stuwe.de/en/housing/halls-of-residence-tuebingen/) and <https://www.my-stuwe.de/en/housing/faqs/>) and send in a copy of your notification of admission as soon as you receive it. (Your application won't be processed until the "Studierendenwerk" has received proof of your admission.)
