<b>Description/content</b>	<p>Graduates of the integrated study programme Mainz-Dijon in German and French Studies are granted two national degrees in the respective disciplines. The programme is based on a fixed binational course of study that focusses on literary studies, linguistics, and cultural studies. Linguistic mediation in the form of French-German translation is also a common study content. In the Franco-German Module, all participants obtain intercultural competencies and reflect on the different education systems. The Franco-German Module includes an intensive language preparation course, which helps students to successfully integrate into the partner system. Once students arrive at the partner university, they may benefit from diverse mobility grants for the duration of their stay abroad (ERASMUS+, Franco-German university network). Furthermore, they are exempt from tuition fees at the host university.</p> <p>The programme also includes an obligatory internship in the partner country that allows students to deepen their intercultural experiences as well as take the first steps towards the creation of an international professional network.</p>

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## Course Details

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### Course organisation

During their first year, all students study at their home university (either in Mainz or in Dijon) and spend their second year at the partner university. While the first year serves as an orientation and a preparation phase, the second year is highly focussed on encountering the partner education system. Students have to perform an internship in the partner country in order to take a look at the foreign labour market. The third year gives major importance to the integration of the student groups starting in both countries. All students spend the fifth semester in Dijon and the sixth semester in Mainz, where each student completes a Bachelor's thesis. Under certain circumstances and upon consultation with the coordinating offices, students may participate in an additional exchange with the Université de Sherbrooke (Canada) during the fifth semester.

### Integrated internships

An internship of at least three or four weeks has to be completed during the break after the fourth and the fifth semester. This internship has to be done in the partner country. The cultural institutions of the partner regions, Maison Rhénanie-Palatinat in Dijon and Haus Burgund in Mainz, provide assistance with finding an internship.

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# Requirements / Registration

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## Academic admission requirements

High school diploma (Abitur, Baccalauréat, or equivalent)

Applicants with a German diploma should apply and start their studies in Mainz. Applicants with a diploma from France or another francophone country should apply and start their studies in Dijon.

## Language requirements

Applicants must provide proof of their German and French skills.

German: DSH-1 or equivalent (for example, Goethe-Zertifikat B2)

French: B2 level (DELF certificate)

Depending on the university where the students start their studies, the language level of the partner language can be improved during the first year of studies.

## Application deadline

15 July for the following winter semester

15 January for the following summer semester

The recognition of the applicant's foreign certificate must be made in advance (calculate at least six weeks for this).
