Description/content

Social Anthropology is the study of socio-cultural practices and the similarities and differences of human experience in relation to their environments. Anthropologists observe, analyse, and interpret in a theoretically informed and methodologically consistent manner domains of social action in which such cultural characteristics materialise.

The aim to compare societies constitutes a key concern of anthropological inquiry and informs its theoretical perspectives and analytical and methodological approaches. Anthropological knowledge and competences enable you to analyse power relations, contribute to constructive and engaged discussions, move respectfully in intercultural settings, and act in a scientifically valid, socially relevant, and ethically responsible manner.

This consecutive MA programme imparts knowledge of the theories and current research issues of social anthropology. This allows students to write the final MA thesis either on the basis of an audiovisual media project or by working on an empirically grounded or literature-based research project with the support of supervising professors and faculty members.

Course Details

Course organisation

Modules one to six offer lectures, tutorials and seminars on the cultural foundation of sociality, on research methods, as well as on the fields Transcultural Psychiatry, Psychological Anthropology, Media Anthropology, Visual Anthropology, Migration Studies, Environmental Anthropology, Anthropology of Religion, Political Anthropology, Conflict Studies and Mediation.

The programme offers regional specialisations in Sub-Saharan Africa, South-East Asia and Indian Ocean littoral societies. Students are encouraged to engage with the research projects of the institute and learn with international fellows hosted at the institute.

The final stages of the programme (module seven) are scheduled for the research project (choice between audiovisual format/ethnographic film/fieldwork/internship/practical training), which is concluded with a MA thesis and an oral examination (viva).

Requirements / Registration

Academic admission requirements Academic admission requirements include a Bachelor's degree in social/cultural anthropology, ethnology or in a discipline containing a major social anthropological component (min. 15 ECTS), and language proficiency at the level of C1 (details below). See the homepage of the institute for further details.

Final overall grade of Bachelor's degree programme: at least 2.3

Language requirements Non-native English speakers must show proficiency in the English language - the level required is C1 (CEFR, 7 IELTS, 93 TOEFL).
