Degree	Bachelor of Arts in Humanities, the Arts, and Social Thought (BA) Upon successful completion of the programme, students obtain a Bachelor of Arts degree that is accredited in the United States. Eligible students also obtain a Bachelor of Arts degree that is accredited in Germany.

Languages	All courses are taught in English. Language study in German from beginner to advanced level is available throughout the programme. In addition, the college offers a handful of courses each year that are taught in German and cover topics related to contemporary German culture and society. All BA candidates must demonstrate intermediate proficiency in German (B1 level) by the end of their second year.

Additional information on beginning, duration and mode of study	Students in their first year at Bard College Berlin complete an introductory course, called Language and Thinking, during the three weeks prior to the official start of the fall semester. The course provides students with tools to write well at the university level, and to use writing as a resource throughout every stage of the learning process.

Description/content **What is the relationship between art and human rights? How does literature affect our world view? Why has there always been a tension between ethics and politics?**

The [BA in Humanities, the Arts, and Social Thought](#) provides the opportunity to specialise in the fields of [Literature and Rhetoric](#), [Ethics and Politics](#), or [Art and Aesthetics](#) alongside a core programme in intellectual history from ancient societies to the present day. Each concentration combines fundamental knowledge with critical reflection and practical experience. Literature and Rhetoric encompasses literary tradition and innovation, creative writing, and study of the discourses of the public sphere. Art and Aesthetics unites studio production with philosophical aesthetics and art history. Ethics and Politics aligns foundational and advanced study of political science with ethics, moral philosophy, and global citizenship. The programme includes courses in civic and social engagement, and a progression toward the capacity to produce and present independent research. In addition, students have the chance to pursue elective study in a wide range of areas. The overarching aims of the BA programme are to cultivate reflective, historically-informed specialist knowledge, an appreciation and understanding of art, literature and thought, a spirit of inquiry and social conscientiousness, and fluency in writing and communication.

Current information Courses at Bard College Berlin take place in person and attendance is required.

Course Details

Course organisation Students take at least four courses per semester during their first three years of studies, and at least three courses per semester during the final year, in addition to writing their final thesis. Students may study abroad for up to two semesters in addition to completing an internship for academic credit as part of their studies. During the fourth year, students write a BA thesis under the close supervision of a faculty adviser.

Each student shapes their specialised academic profile through their chosen area of concentration, and is guided by faculty members who help the student to select relevant courses according to the student's interests and future plans. Within the elective component of the degree, students may choose from a wide variety of courses in the arts, humanities, and social sciences. German language courses at all levels are offered at the college, and enable students to acquire working knowledge of the language, as well as attain advanced proficiency. All BA candidates must demonstrate intermediate proficiency in German (B1 level) by the end of their second year.

Requirements / Registration

Academic admission requirements

Students must have a high school diploma (or equivalent) by the time they enrol.

Required application materials include a completed online application form, a motivation statement, a writing sample, two academic letters of recommendation from teachers, official transcripts, and proof of advanced English proficiency for non-native English speakers (see below). Students who wish to share their creative work are encouraged to upload a creative portfolio as supplementary material.

Language requirements

Applicants must provide proof of English proficiency at level C1 according to the Common European Framework of Reference for Languages. We accept the following tests:

- TOEFL iBT (minimum score: 95)
- TOEFL Essentials (minimum score: 10)
- IELTS Academic (minimum score: 7.0)
- Cambridge (CAE: A-C, CPE: A-C)
- Duolingo English test (minimum score: 120)

Career advisory service

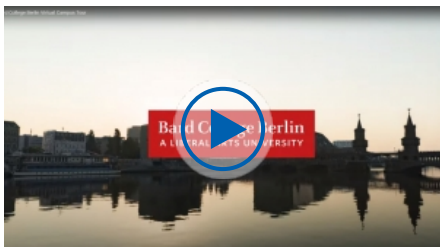

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Bard College Berlin was founded to bring the ideals and practices of liberal arts education to the centre of the European higher education system: undergraduate teaching by professors and artists; small-group seminar and workshop formats; academic advising; interdisciplinary study; a core curriculum. The college and its programmes are accredited at state level in Berlin and at federal level in Germany, and accredited in the United States through affiliation since 2012 with Bard College Annandale, which is the leading institution in a global network of universities and colleges committed to an open society and democratic values.

Students come to Bard College Berlin from all over the world. They pursue interdisciplinary degree programmes in the arts, humanities, and social sciences, and link their education with projects of civic and social engagement, as well as opportunities for practical training and professional development. Working with faculty and their peers, students become part of a vibrant international community and a centre of learning and creativity connected to the city of Berlin. Qualifying graduates earn a German as well as an American BA degree.



University location

As a European capital with a population of 3.6 million, Berlin is an exciting and cosmopolitan urban setting. BCB's campus—nestled in a residential neighbourhood on the northeastern edge of the city—offers a quiet, green environment for focused studies. Students are well-connected to the centre of the city with a direct public transport line.
