Come along on this voyage of discovery: from the legacy of Schiller, Goethe, Wieland, and the Bauhaus, you will learn the German language in an active and hands-on way! Free visits to exciting cultural sites such as the Goethe House, the City Palace, or the brand-new Bauhaus Museum are part of the course programme. An exciting outdoor lesson with a visit to the Wartburg in Eisenach will take you deep into the roots of German culture.</p> <p>Even outside of the course, you can fully immerse yourself in the German language and exchange</p>

ideas with your fellow students. Our varied social programme offers many opportunities, which vary from chats during our game nights, visits to the cinema to improve your listening comprehension, and opportunities to expand your vocabulary by discussing exciting ingredients at the international dinner to a karaoke evening during which the bravest amongst you can sing their favourite songs. On the weekends, you can join excursions to various nearby cities, such as Dessau, Leipzig, or Erfurt. There will also be social events accompanying the course.
