| Description/content | The Master's and doctoral degree programmes provide advanced studies in Jewish theology and thought, with intensive training in specialised areas for a career in academic scholarship, religious education, and, in cooperation with our colleges, the academic training for rabbinical and cantorial students. We are the only institute offering this kind of programmes in Europe, forming the future generations of theologically-trained and philosophically-trained scholars, educators, active members in culture and arts, and community leaders, able to turn to the tradition in novel and creative ways. Students pursuing one of the programmes require, at their appropriate level, a knowledge of languages (Biblical Hebrew and Jewish Babylonian Aramaic) and may be required to do course work prior to enrolment. |

| Accommodation | There are several student dormitories in Potsdam. These are administered exclusively by Potsdam's Association for Student Affairs ("Studentenwerk Potsdam"). You can apply for a room in one of these dormitories if you are under the age of 30. If you are a Master's student, you can only apply if the degree at the University of Potsdam is your first Master's programme. Additionally, there are also a few private dormitories in Potsdam, to which these conditions do not apply. However, many students prefer to find an apartment in Potsdam or Berlin, which they often share with fellow students. The housing market is very tight, so please start looking for an accommodation as early as possible.
