Description/content	The Bonn International Graduate School for Development Research (BIGS-DR) is a structured doctoral programme at the Center for Development Research (ZEF). This programme is part of a group of international graduate schools at the University of Bonn that maintains the highest level of academic quality. ZEF is led by three renowned professors in the areas of social sciences, economics, and ecology: Prof Dr Matin Qaim (economics), Prof Dr Christian Borgemeister (ecology) and PD Dr Eva Youkhana (social sciences).
	BIGS-DR is an excellent choice as a stepping stone for your international career in the field of development research or policy. Our mission is to attract talented young scientists from all over the world to pursue their development research interests. At ZEF, students are exposed to an international community guided by a challenging research environment.
	The interdisciplinary research agenda of ZEF tackles issues relevant to the Global South such as climate change, poverty reduction, food security, migration, and risk management.
	BIGS-DR offers a broad, interdisciplinary coursework to development research and sound training

in theories and methods of selected disciplines. Doctoral students conduct research to collect primary data. Combining theories, methods, and practical experience in the areas of social, economic, and ecological change enables students to explore new fields and be competitive in an international job market.

Course Details

Course organisation	BIGS-DR is a full-time programme with a duration of three and a half years. Doctoral students will participate in coursework, conduct field research, and complete their theses within this time frame. In addition, students take part in soft skills workshops that train them in academic writing, working interculturally, leadership skills, and ethical considerations.
	On average, it takes three to four years for BIGS-DR students to complete their dissertations and obtain their doctoral degrees. During this time frame, they participate in a tailor-made course programme, conduct field research, analyse data, write academic papers, and present their results at international conferences. Furthermore, students improve their career prospects by attending workshops on academic writing, intercultural training, and research ethics.
	As a structured doctoral programme, BIGS-DR provides intensive supervision and tutorship. Doctoral students are supported and guided by a team of experts consisting of their supervisors and senior researchers at ZEF.
	Upon successfully defending their dissertation, students are awarded a doctoral degree from one of the faculties of the University of Bonn (agriculture, natural sciences, social sciences, economics, etc.).

Semester contribution	The University of Bonn is a public university, meaning that it does not charge tuition fees. However, all students must pay the so-called social contribution (= semester fee) of about 330 EUR per semester. It includes among other things a student transit pass for public transport and a statutory accident insurance.
Costs of living	The cost of living for students in Bonn is around 1,200 EUR, with rent accounting for the largest share. The funds you need to secure for your research will vary from project to project, but they usually range from 5,000 to 20,000 EUR.

The Study Buddy programme matches newly-arrived international students (mentees) with a University of Bonn student (buddy) who helps them as they start their studies and adjust to life in Bonn. The buddies give tips, advice and assistance that make it easier for their mentees to become familiar with the university and get settled in Bonn.
