Description/content	The consecutive study programme covers the core disciplines of business administration: accounting, controlling, corporate finance and business taxation. The courses take into account the interdependencies of these disciplines. A particular advantage is the option to study one or two of the disciplines as a major. Other benefits include the consideration of digitalisation as well as sustainability. Students can learn data analysis and programming by choosing specific courses. The programme is suitable for people who have studied at least two of the relevant disciplines in their Bachelor's degree programmes and would like to significantly extend and deepen the acquired knowledge.

Course Details

Course organisation

The course of study lasts three or four semesters. In the first semester, students extend their competencies acquired in the Bachelor's programmes. In the second semester, more specialised

courses are offered. In the third semester, students write the Master's thesis. This is postponed to the fourth semester if students complete an internship or a semester abroad (possibly with a double degree) in the third semester. Methodologically, the courses are characterised by seminar-based teaching. Case studies, some of which take place in cooperation with companies, play an important role. In this way, students practice applying and deepening the knowledge they have acquired and establish company contacts.

Integrated internships

Students who have completed a Bachelor's degree with only 180 credit points (generally corresponding to a three-year Bachelor's programme) will be required to complete a work experience placement in the third semester, which is worth 30 credit points. Students with a Bachelor's degree worth 210 credit points who have already done supervised work during an undergraduate programme are not required to do so, but they may also take a placement in the third semester if they wish.

Academic admission requirements

- Bachelor's degree or equivalent qualification
- At least 210 ECTS credit points (Applicants with 180 credit points must acquire an additional 30 credit points from an integrated period of practical training, extending the Master's course of studies by one semester.)

- Proof that at least two of the four relevant study subjects (accounting, controlling, corporate finance, and company taxation) were concluded in the previous course of studies with at least 20 ECTS in total
- Letter of motivation
- Curriculum vitae

By providing a GMAT score of 600 points or above, you can significantly increase your chance of admission.

Very good knowledge of English, at least corresponding to level B2 of the Common European Framework, e.g.

- IELTS 6.0 points
