| Description/content                    | <p>The Modern China programme is divided into three fields. Language training in modern Chinese (Mandarin) will take up about half of the students' time. Speaking, reading, and writing skills will be developed equally. Several courses deal with methodological topics – basic philological methods and Chinese word processing and data research in the world wide web will be taught. Students will also be introduced to Chinese political science and macroeconomics. Lectures and courses will be offered on a variety of topics, including Chinese history, politics, ecology, media, literature, material culture, modern arts, gender studies, and philosophy. Students may choose from these modules according to their own interests.</p> |

| Course organisation                                  | <p>At the beginning of their studies, students will be provided with a programme and a schedule, which will show obligatory and optional courses. The degree will be reached cumulatively, i.e. credit points (ECTS) will be granted for all modules successfully passed and for the thesis. When students acquire the required number of credit points (180 CP), they will receive their diploma without a further final examination. | Integrated study abroad unit(s)                      | <p>The fourth semester will be spent at Peking University and will be fully integrated into the programme. The programme in Beijing will be coordinated by the European Language and Culture Programme (ECLC).</p>   |

However, you must pay the semester contribution each semester for enrolment or registration. The student contribution includes a semester ticket that allows you to use public transportation all throughout the beautiful city of Würzburg.</p> <p>Student contribution: approx. 146 EUR</p>                                     |
| Costs of living                        | <p>The cost of living in Würzburg is low compared to other German cities. ## Services

Possibility of finding part-  
time employment

- **Students from countries within the EU and the EEA** are on equal terms in the labour market and are allowed to work during their course of study.
- **Students from other countries** are allowed to work 120 full days or 240 half days per year (which also includes voluntary internships). If you would like to work more, you will need permission from the employment agency ("Agentur für Arbeit") or the immigration office.
- Important: Be sure your studies will not suffer if you have a side job!

Accommodation

The [Student Housing Service](#) ("Studentenwerk") is responsible for 10 dormitories in various locations in Würzburg.

Amenities:

- Single and double rooms or rooms in apartments in which two to four students share a kitchen and a bathroom.
- All rooms and apartments are furnished.
- Dishes, cooking items, bedding, and towels are not provided.

Length of stay:

- The rental contracts of the "Studentenwerk" are temporary contracts.
- The fixed-term rental contracts of the "Studentenwerk" can be terminated in writing with two months' notice for the following deadlines: 31 March or 30 September.

- Deadlines: **15 June for the winter semester and 15 January for the summer semester** (The student housing service must receive the security deposit of 300 EUR by this date.)
