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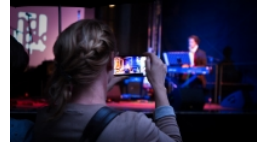

Description/content	The BA Music Production programme is a playing field for musical all-rounders who want to direct

the creative and technical design of songs: from the first idea to the performance or finished production.

The main focus of the study is the combination of sound engineer content with an artistic education in composition and instrumental-vocal music. The work in our studios and at DAWs forms the practical basis for experiencing, training and reflecting on all relevant functions and roles in the music production process right from the first semester.

Additional weekly workshops on a variety of music topics such as songwriting and sound engineering, live panels with music editors, producers, labels and publishers as well as various practical projects in each semester offer the opportunity to try out in front of an audience and to build up a network with representatives of the music business. Professors and lecturers from all areas of the live and recording industry provide support on your own career path.

Requirements / Registration

Academic admission requirements

- General higher education entrance qualification ("Abitur") or university of applied sciences entrance qualification ("Fachhochschulreife")
- CV
- **Two songs in MP3 format** for your studies, you must choose and present an instrument (or vocals) as your main subject. Please upload your own compositions or interpretations of foreign pieces with your application (each lasting one to four minutes).
- Letter of motivation: why do you want to study Music Production with us? What do you expect to get from your studies? Where do you see yourself in the future? (maximum two pages)
- Copy of your identity card or passport

Services

Possibility of finding part-time employment

Working as a non-EU citizen: In possession of a valid German residence permit for study purposes, you are allowed to work for up to 120 full days (full day = eight hours per day) or 240 half days (half day = four hours) during the calendar year. However, freelance work is not permitted. Internships that are mandatory for the successful completion of your studies at SRH do not count towards the above-named 120 full days.

Employment that is considered "student part-time work" ("studentische Nebentätigkeit", e.g. employment as a student worker at a university or in a university-related organisation or "Werkstudent" activities at companies that are related to your studies) can be done without any time restrictions.

Accommodation

We do not own any student dormitories or hostels. However, we provide assistance in selecting accommodation prior to and after your arrival in Berlin.
