Target group	Our intensive language courses are ideal for international students and prospective students who want to learn German effectively within in a rather short time frame and who need an approved certificate for their course of study or job.
Description/content	Our intensive language courses combine diverse and goal-oriented language training with insight into German culture and everyday life in Germany. Course participants at each level will receive a fixed number (200 hours) of language instruction. The courses end with a final test.
	We teach levels A1, A2, B1, B2, and C1 of the Common European Framework of Reference for Languages (CEFR):

- Course duration per level: approx. two months
- Online placement test prior to course begin
- 200 teaching units of 45 minutes per day for each level
- Daily face-to-face lessons, plus additional self-directed learning via an online platform
- Pre-study activities and learning techniques
- Teaching and learning materials included
- Preparation for certified qualifications:

 - the DSH at the Studienkolleg Sachsen of Leipzig University as a prerequisite for studying in Germany
