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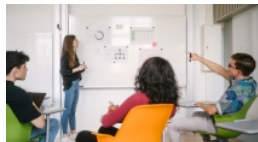

Description/content

Are you planning to study in Germany?

The HTW Foundation's **Pre-DSH Programme** is aimed at prospective students with a university entrance qualification who are not yet enrolled at a German university and offers them:

- German language courses from level B2.2 to C1+
- Intense preparation for the DSH examination at HTW Berlin (DSH = German language examination for university entrance)
- Workshops to improve general study skills
- Cultural activities in Berlin and social on-campus activities
- Participation in the DSH examination at HTW Berlin

In addition to the intensive classes in academic German, reading and listening comprehension, text production, and oral communication, we also offer modules that prepare students for their future studies in Germany (e.g. presentation skills, academic writing, intercultural communication, time management, learning strategies). The programme also features laboratory visits, campus tours, and step-by-step counselling on applying for a degree programme in Germany.

The programme consists of 24 classroom hours (45 minutes per classroom hour) per week.

You will also obtain an invitation letter in order to apply for a visa.
