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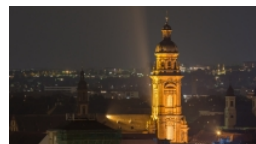

Description/content	<p>The <b>Management International</b> Master's programme is a fully English-speaking programme designed for students who seek an international study experience or international career, and international students.</p> <p>The programme includes a core curriculum covering the necessary knowledge and skills in management, economics, data analytics, and research &amp; communication. Students can choose courses from those areas to explore their fields of interest and learn necessary skills and methods.</p> <p>Students can further specialise by selecting a focus area according to their individual preferences. The programme currently offers three tracks:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>Finance &amp; Accounting</li></ul>

- Operations & Information Management
- Marketing & Entrepreneurship

## Course Details

<b>Course organisation</b>	<p>The first year of the programme covers courses from the areas of management, economics, data analytics, and research &amp; communication. Students can choose from a selection of courses from those areas to finish the core programme.</p> <p>The second year of the programme allows students to specialise in a focus area by selecting a track. Each track offers a selection of courses and seminars. Moreover, students write their Master's thesis in the respective track at the end of the programme.</p> <p>It is recommended to complete a possible semester abroad in the third or fourth semester.</p>

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## Costs / Funding

<b>Tuition fees per semester in EUR</b>	None
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<b>Semester contribution</b>	<p>There are generally no tuition fees at the University of Würzburg. However, you must pay the semester contribution each semester for enrolment or registration. The student contribution includes a semester ticket that allows you to use public transportation all throughout the beautiful city of Würzburg.</p>
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Student contribution: approx. 162.90 EUR

<b>Costs of living</b>	<p>The cost of living in Würzburg is low compared to other German cities. Of course, this strongly depends on your individual lifestyle, but you should expect monthly costs of about 940 EUR.</p>
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- Food: 250 EUR
- Rent: 350 EUR
- Health insurance: 110 EUR
- Other: 212 EUR
- Broadcasting fees (AZDBS/GEZ): 18 EUR

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## Requirements / Registration

## Academic admission requirements

Admission to the Management International Master's programme requires a Bachelor's degree in business administration or economics that covers core competencies in management, economics, and methods. Applicants meeting the competencies requirement are admitted based on the final grade of their Bachelor's degree or a GMAT score, if applicable.

## Language requirements

### Language requirements in English

English language skills should be at a level of B2. Alternatively, language requirements can be met by:

1. Test of English as a Foreign language (TOEFL) with at least 72 points (Internet-based TOEFL)
2. International English Language Test System (IELTS) with a score of 6.0 or better
3. Cambridge First Certificate in English (FCE)
4. Bachelor's degree from an English-taught course

### Language requirements in German

Proof of German skills at basic (A2) level is required by the end of the re-registration period in the third semester at the latest – it is not necessary for application.

# Services

## Possibility of finding part-time employment

- **Students from countries within the EU and the EEA** are on equal terms in the labour market and are allowed to work during their course of study.
- **Students from other countries** are allowed to work 120 full days or 240 half days per year (which also includes voluntary internships). If you would like to work more, you will need permission from the employment agency ("Agentur für Arbeit") or the immigration office.
- Important: Be sure your studies will not suffer if you have a side job!

## Accommodation

The [Student Housing Service](#) ("Studentenwerk") is responsible for 10 dormitories in various locations in Würzburg.

Amenities:

- Single and double rooms or rooms in apartments in which two to four students share a kitchen and a bathroom.
- All rooms and apartments are furnished.
- Dishes, cooking items, bedding, and towels are not provided.

Length of stay:

- The rental contracts of the "Studentenwerk" are temporary contracts.
- The fixed-term rental contracts of the "Studentenwerk" can be terminated in writing with two months' notice for the following deadlines: 31 March or 30 September.

Application:

- Deadlines: **15 June for the winter semester and 15 January for the summer semester**(The student housing service must receive the security deposit of 300 EUR by this date.)
- You will receive further information about applying for housing in your letter of acceptance.

New University of Würzburg

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The Faculty of Business Management and Economic is committed to teaching the theory, models and methodology of the various disciplines in Business Management and Economics to the current state of scientific knowledge of each intended qualification (Bachelor, Master, Doctorate). The classes also cover the cultural, social and ecological impact of economic activity and decisions. Particular significance is attached to developing the students' ability to reason and make judgements based on academic argumentation.

The Faculty of Business Management and Economics provides an academic qualification for a professional career in industry as well as public and private organisations, whereby a clear distinction is made between the types of degree. The first priority is the teaching of fundamental economic knowledge and competences. The ability to make one's own informed decisions in real-life business situations, including new problem situations, while taking ethical aspects into account, is of great importance. Students are actively encouraged to spend time studying abroad to improve their intercultural awareness and skills.

The Faculty of Business Management and Economics is an integral part of the University, not a separate entity as in the case of private Business Schools. It participates actively in interdisciplinary courses with other faculties such as Business Information Systems, Business Mathematics, China Business and Economics, or European Law. The Faculty is also involved in the Graduate School 'Law, Economics and Society'. In this way, the Faculty contributes to the interdisciplinary, interfaculty cooperation at the University of Würzburg and to the diversity of its degree courses.

There are a number of specialisations in teaching and research at the University which might perhaps not be regarded as unique in themselves but which taken together, nevertheless give the Faculty of Business Management and Economics a distinctive profile.

These include:

- Finance, Accounting and Taxation
- Logistics, Supply Chain Management, Business Information Systems
- Entrepreneurship and Management, Human Resource Management and Organisation, Marketing
- Research Centre for Risk Management
- Economics specialising in the European Economic System
- Graduate School of Law, Economics and Society



## University location

Würzburg is a charming city in Bavaria located at river Main, conveniently accessible from all over Germany. It is widely famous for its cultural treasures, such as the Residence (UNESCO World Heritage), Marienberg Fortress and the Old Main Bridge, its prestigious vineyards, and its natural beauty. The University, first founded in 1402, is the oldest one in Bavaria and one of the oldest in Germany.
