Students begin to work on their Master's theses in the third semester and complete their theses in the fourth semester. The Master's thesis is written in German.

Language requirements	 Knowledge of German at level C1 of the Common European Framework of Reference for Languages (for students starting their studies in Guadalajara, this level must be demonstrated at the beginning of their studies in Leipzig) Knowledge of Spanish at level B2 of the Common European Framework of Reference for Languages (reading comprehension) Knowledge of Spanish at level B1 of the Common European Framework of Reference for Languages (other skills)
