	The programme focuses on issues such as Company Law, Contract Law, Intellectual Property Law, CISG (Contracts for the International Sale of Goods), and WTO Law as well as Private International Law, Transnational Litigation, and International Arbitration. Additionally, an introductory course on German Law is offered for interested students from abroad.
