Network development and qualification measures based on the model of the German universities of applied sciences in Kenya 2017–2019

Demand on the Kenyan labour market for qualified specialists with practice-oriented degrees has been increasing for years. The Kenyan higher education system, with its strong theoretical focus, cannot adequately meet this need. Expanding the Kenyan higher education system by including elements of higher education with a practical orientation and by involving industry and business in the development process of this innovative approach can counteract this problem.

The typical characteristics of German universities of applied sciences meet this need, but have not been established in the Kenyan higher education system so far. In order to inform interested Kenyan university teachers and junior academics about the teaching practices at universities of applied sciences and to train them accordingly, suitable training measures should be designed, organised and delivered at German universities of applied sciences. These training measures should also include integrated practice-oriented modules in companies. At the preliminary stage and throughout the programme, preparatory trips from and to Kenya can also be supported to establish contact between universities; at the same time, the model of the German university of applied sciences can be promoted in Kenya by means of special measures (e.g. workshops, summer schools). If representatives of Kenyan universities, in consultation with their university administration (supporting letter), have already developed their own concepts to introduce teaching practices based on the model of German universities of applied sciences, these individuals may also apply for funding in order to implement their concept within the framework of this programme. This funding scheme is intended to lay the foundation for the formation of sustainable networks and higher education partnerships.

As a further step, the intention is to develop an Eastern African-German University of Applied Sciences.

This programme will be funded by the Federal Foreign Office (AA).

Aims:

- Kenyan university teachers and junior academics gain in-depth knowledge of the model of the German university of applied sciences
- Personal and institutional contacts between Germany and Kenya are reinforced and established
- Kenyan university teachers and junior academics are able to design and deliver teaching activities based on the model of the German university of applied sciences
- Intercultural understanding is strengthened on both sides

Who can apply? State and state-approved German universities of applied sciences are eligible to apply. The German university submitting the application can act either on its own or as the leader of a consortium together with other German universities of applied sciences.

Funding measures:

Travel to Kenya by representatives from German universities of applied sciences with the aim of establishing contact with Kenyan universities: To analyse local circumstances and to establish

the requirements in the individual departments, representatives can visit universities, meet with other relevant institutions and establish initial contacts for potential academic cooperation.

- Events and workshops in Kenya and Germany: content-related focus – e.g. information on the structure, teaching practices and industry/business contacts of the model of the German universities of applied sciences, specialist workshops and further training, recruiting activities for interested and qualified Kenyan university teachers and junior academics for further training in line with the model of the German university of applied sciences. Events and workshops may also be combined with stages of an Internet-based transfer of knowledge and skills.
- **Travel within Germany** by representatives of German universities of applied sciences for coordination activities with project partners.
- **Travel to Germany** by representatives of Kenyan universities to allow meetings with German universities for the mutual exchange of information and initiation of partnerships.
- Travel to Germany by Kenyan university lecturers and junior academics for short visits: further training activities at German universities of applied sciences with integrated practice-oriented element in companies (e.g. insight into the structure and subjectrelated teaching at universities of applied sciences, train-thetrainer activities). These stays should be designed by the German partner university in such a way that the practical orientation of teaching activities at universities of applied sciences is communicated, and can be granted as short visits (max. two weeks) or as short-term scholarship of up to a max. six-month duration for visits to Germany.
- **Summer schools** in Kenya and Germany: for Kenyan lecturers, doctoral students, university teachers (costs of travel and living allowance).

In order to ensure the sustainability of the various measures, **networking activities** can also be funded (cost of materials, fees and travel to Kenya and to Germany).

Concepts for the planned measures are to be worked out by the German university and submitted with the application. If contacts with Kenya are already in place, these must be mentioned in the application.

Funding:

The maximum funding is EUR 100,000 per funding year. The approval of funding will be granted as a funding agreement (full financing) between the DAAD and the German university.
