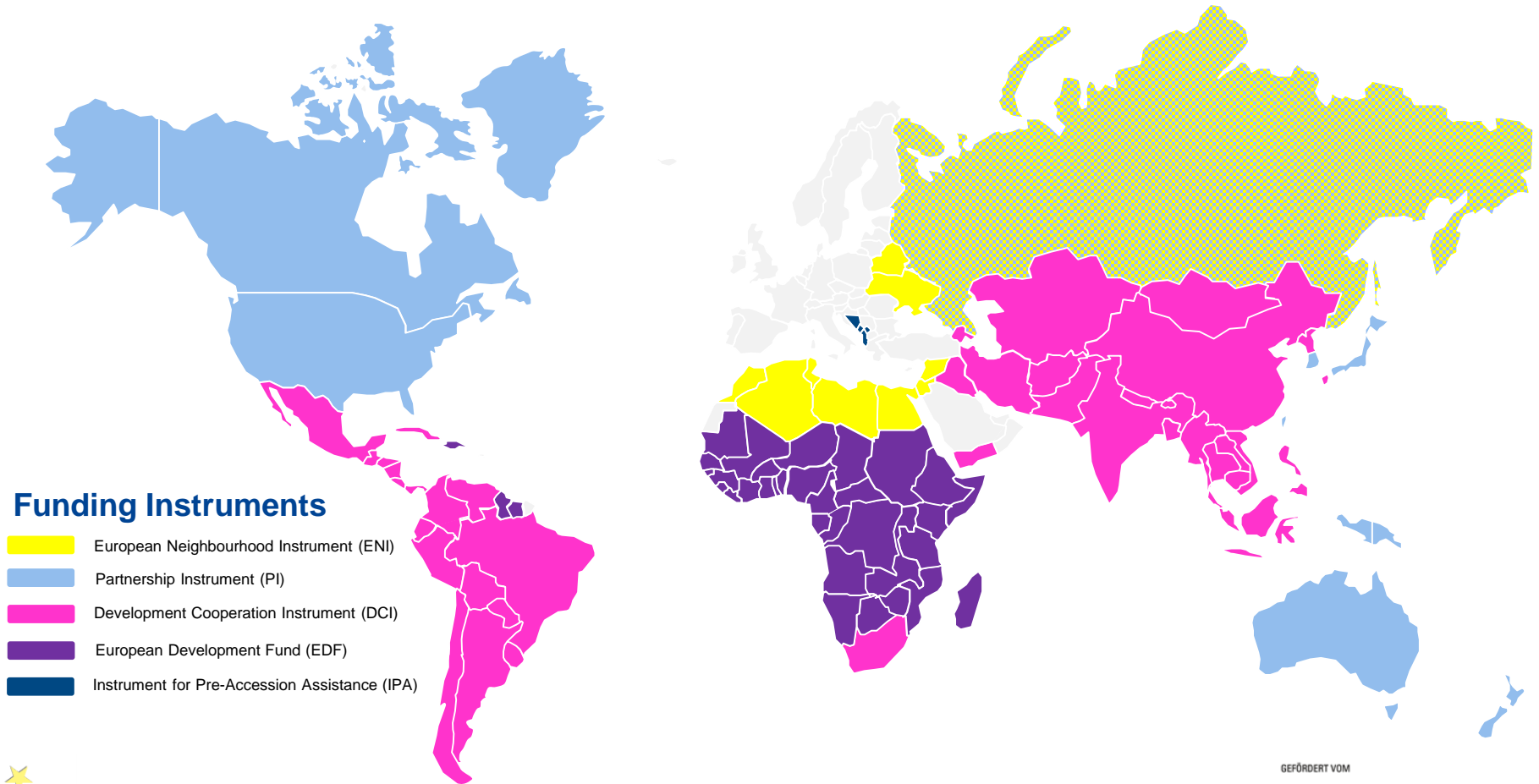

- ❖ Civil society organisations and local authorities

Erasmus+ International Credit Mobility Individual Funding

What is being funded?

- ❖ Mobility of individuals in academia between Programme and Partner Countries
- ❖ **Participants:** students and staff
 - ❖ Individual support: fixed rates for participants
 - ❖ Travel costs: according to the distance calculator of the European Commission
- ❖ **Higher Education Institutions**
 - ❖ Organisational support: fixed rates per mobility for applicant



Erasmus+ International Credit Mobility

Individual Funding Students

Students (study and/or training)

- ❖ To Germany 850 Euro per month
- ❖ From Germany 700 Euro per month
- ❖ 3-12 months study
- ❖ 2-12 months training
- ❖ All study cycles: Bachelor, Master, PhD
- ❖ All fields of study
- ❖ Social top up (200 Euro per month) for students
 - ❖ with children
 - ❖ with special needs



Erasmus+ International Credit Mobility Individual Funding Staff

Staff (teaching and/or training)

- ❖ To Germany 160 Euro per day
- ❖ From Germany 180 Euro per day
- ❖ Minimum 5, maximum 60 days
- ❖ Teaching: minimum 8 teaching hours per week (5 days)
- ❖ Training: job shadowing, training at partner HEI or other relevant organisations

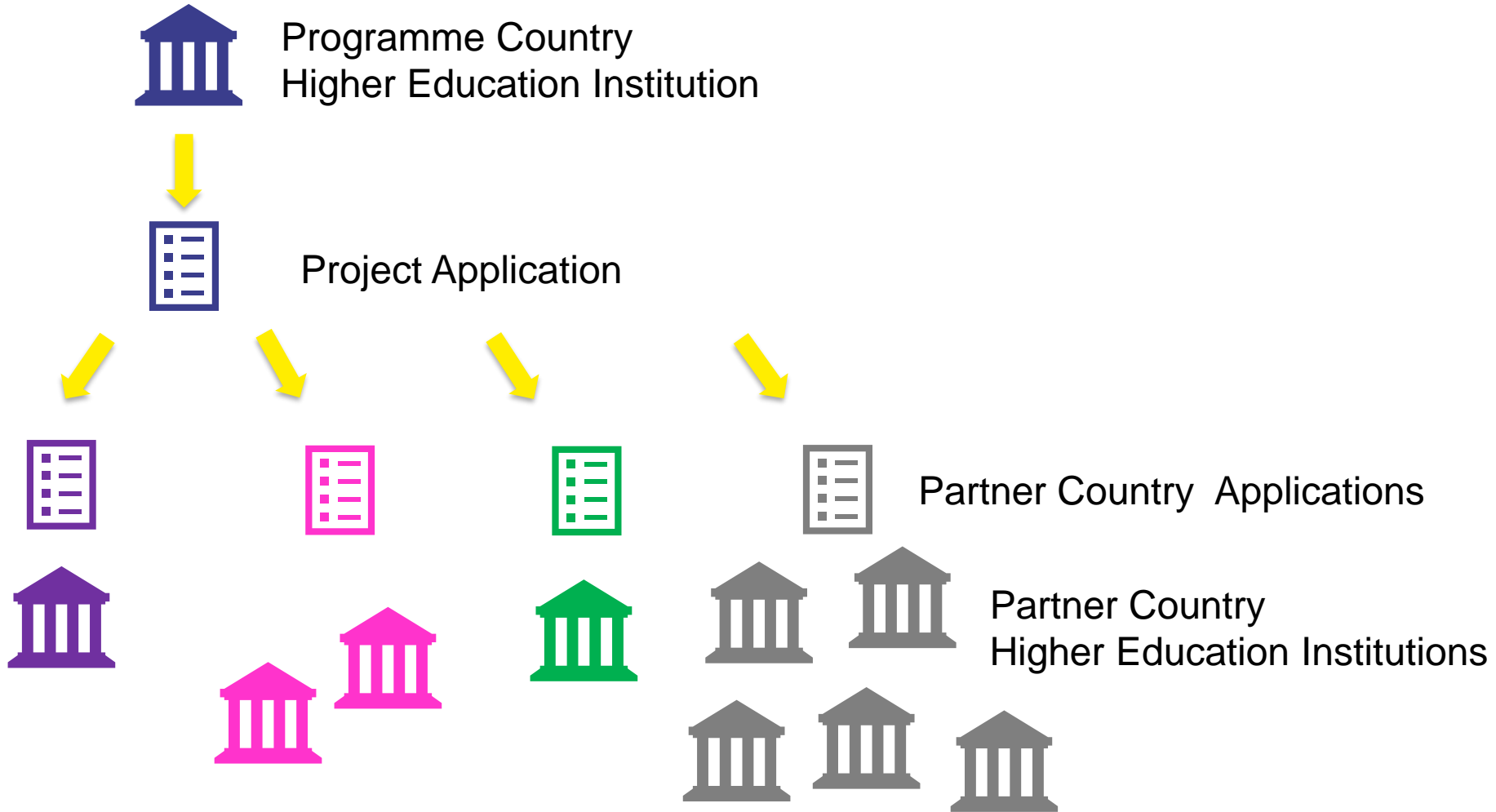

Erasmus+ International Credit Mobility Application Process

- ❖ Programme Country HEI apply with National Agency for projects with one or more Partner Countries
- ❖ Each application can contain any number of Partner HEI
- ❖ Partner Country HEI need to be acknowledged by National Authority (public and private)
- ❖ Each Partner Country application is evaluated by external experts according to four quality criteria
- ❖ Project duration 24 or 36 months (start as of 1 August)

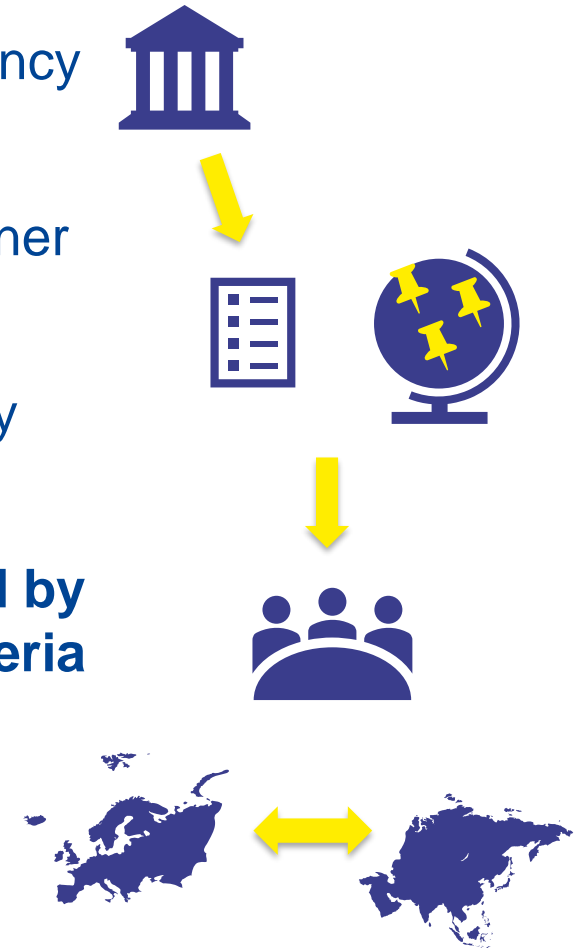


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Erasmus+ International Credit Mobility Application Process – Quality Criteria

Criteria	Elements of analysis under award criteria
Relevance of the strategy (maximum 30 points)	The extent to which the planned mobility is relevant to the internationalisation strategy of the higher education institutions involved (both in the Programme and in the Partner Country) and the rationale for choosing staff and/or student mobility.
Quality of the cooperation arrangements (maximum 30 Points)	The extent to which the applicant organisation has previous experience of similar projects with higher education institutions in the Partner Country and any non-academic partners in both the Programme and Partner Country; the clarity of the description of responsibilities, roles and tasks between partners.
Quality of the activity design and implementation (maximum 20 points)	The completeness and quality of arrangements for the selection of participants, the support provided to them and the recognition of their mobility period (in particular in the Partner Country).
Impact and dissemination (maximum 20 points)	The potential impact of the mobility on participants, beneficiaries and partner organisations at local, regional and national levels, as well as the quality of measures aimed at disseminating the results of the mobility projects at faculty and institution level (and beyond, where applicable), in both the Programme and Partner Countries.

Inter-Institutional Agreement

- ❖ Must be signed before start of project
- ❖ Sets out mobility flows & conditions:
 - ❖ Non-discrimination
 - ❖ Full recognition of learning outcomes
 - ❖ No fees charged
 - ❖ Publish course catalogue
 - ❖ Support of participants (language, documents, logistics, assistance for visas, accommodation, insurance...)

Inter-institutional¹ agreement 2014-20[21]² between institutions from Programme and Partner Countries³

[Minimum requirements]⁴

The institutions named below agree to cooperate for the exchange of students and/or staff in the context of the Erasmus+ programme. They commit to respect the quality requirements of the Erasmus Charter for Higher Education in all aspects of the organisation and management of the mobility, in particular the recognition of the credits (or equivalent) awarded to students by the partner institution. 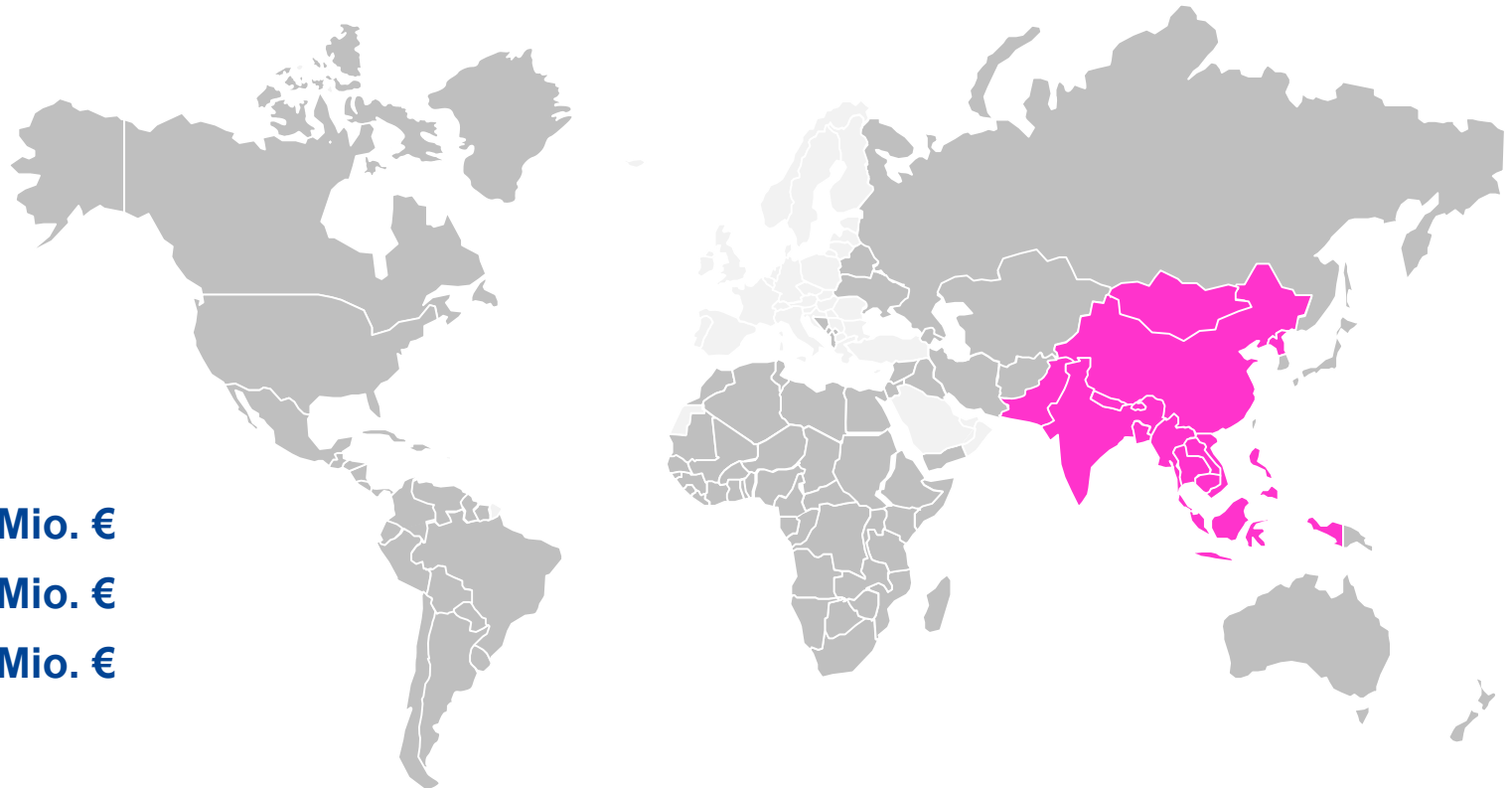

- ❖ Must be signed before start of mobility by sending and receiving Higher Education Institution/organisation and staff
- ❖ Sets out the planned duration of the mobility, the activities to be carried out and the expected outcomes and impact

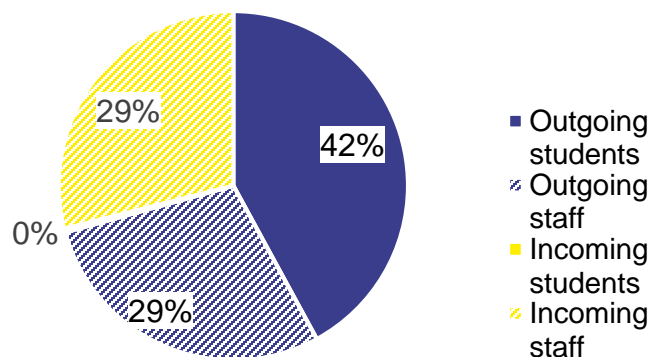

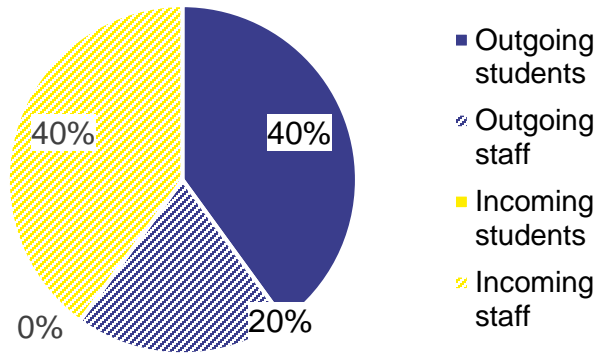

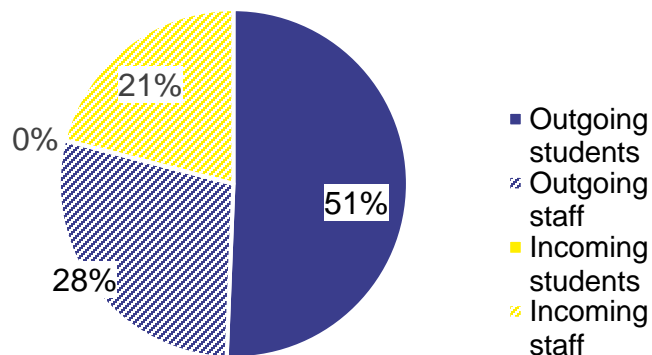
