AT A GLANCE

- UNIMED, an association of 118 universities coming from 23 Mediterranean countries active, from 1991, in the field of internationalization
- RESCUE (Refugees Education
 Support in MENA Countries) is a
 project supporting higher education
 institutions in reacting to the refugee
 crisis for their inclusion in the society
- The project is funded under Erasmus+, KA2 – Capacity-Building in the Field of Higher Education and it is focused on Lebanon, Jordan and Iraq

CORE OBJECTIVES

- 1. Support partner country universities in creating ad hoc units (the Refugee Student Operational Support Unit R-SOS)
- 2. Ease tensions between local community and refugees/IDPs/vulnerable groups, by supporting inclusiveness of disadvantaged people
- 3. Reduce fragmentation and duplication of initiative by enhance coordination and national and regional level

ACHIEVEMENTS SO FAR

- 8 R-SOS units opened and daily working in Lebanon (3), Jordan (3), Iraq (2)
- More than 150 hours of capacity building training delivered for the benefit of MENA university staff
- 4 study visits performed by MENA university staff in Germany, Italy, Spain and Turkey
- More than 20 crash courses delivered by trained R-SOS staff for the benefit of refugees/IDPs/ vulnerable groups in Lebanon, Jordan and Iraq
- Set up of cooperation agreements with relevant stakeholders (e.g. UNHCR) for R-SOS exploitation and sustainability
- Informative sessions performed in refugee camps: Domiz 1, Azraq and Zaatari, and deprived areas

LESSONS LEARNT

- Always take into consideration hosting communities needs
- Increase coordination among stakeholders for avoiding duplication and fragmentation
- Strong coordination with local partners and regular field visits are crucial for a constantly updated state of the art
- Enhance cooperation with scholarship providers for a review of scholarship criteria
- Tailored approach is needed for each country and, if the case, for each university institution
- Cooperation with international and local NGOs is crucial for project activities success
